





Appendix B: Format of Parish Records

Form of Marriage Entry

In Margin: number of entry, names of couple

Entry Text:

On (date of the marriage), after the publication of three banns of marriage done from the pulpit at our parish masses between (name of groom), (groom's occupation), adult [or minor] son of (name of groom's father) and of (name of groom's mother), of this parish [or name of parish where they reside], on the one hand; and (name of bride), adult [or minor] daughter of (name of bride's father), and of (name of bride's mother), also of this parish [or name of parish where they reside] on the other hand; having found no impediment, and the respective parents having declared their consent [included in case one or both of the couple are minors], I, priest undersigned, received their mutual consent and granted them the nuptial blessing, in the presence of [here follows a list of individuals present and witnessing the marriage] who have signed below [or declared that they are unable to sign].

Witnessses' signatures or marks.

Signature of Priest

NOTES: Some variations on this form that may occur include notation of dispensation from publishing one or more of the banns of marriage; omission of the occupation of the groom; addition of the occupations of the fathers; addition of "late" [feu] to indicate that a parent is deceased; where one party to the marriage is widowed, the name of the late husband or wife is given in place of the person's parents; notation of dispensation in cases where the couple are within the prohibited degrees of consanguinity; and identification of witnesses' relationship to the couple (for example brother of the groom; uncle of the bride, etc.).

Form of Baptism Entry

In Margin: number of entry, name of child

Entry Text:

On (date of baptism), I undersigned priest, baptized (name of child), born (date of birth) of the lawful marriage [or illegitimate union] of (father's name), (occupation of father), and of (name of mother) of this parish [or name of the parish where they reside]. Godfather, (name of godfather), godmother, (name of godmother), who have signed below [or declared that they are unable to sign].

In Margin: number of entry, name of deceased

Entry Text:

On (date of burial), I, undersigned priest, buried in the cemetery of this parish [or name of other cemetery], the body of (name of deceased), (occupation of deceased), husband of/wife of/child of (name of spouse or of parents if a child), who died on (date of death). He/she was (age) old. Present were (name of first witness) and (name of second witness), undersigned [or who declared that they are unable to sign].

Arsenault, Bona. Histoire et généalogie des Acadiens. Editions Lemeac: Ottawa, 1978. 6 vols. Arsenault, along with Bergeron (below) are the two earliest sources for Acadian family research. This French language series presents the historical background of Acadian settlers as well as references to specific families and individuals.

Bergeron, Adrien. Le grand arrangement des Acadiens au Québec: Notes de petitehistoire genealogiques: France, Acadie, Québec de 1625-1925. Editions Elysee: Montréal, 1981. 7 vols. French language. The more immediately useful of the two primary family histories on Acadia. Contains information on French ancestry of the original settlers of Acadia.

Griffiths, N.E.S. *The Contexts of Acadian History, 1686-1784*. McGill-Queen's University Press: Montréal, 1992. English language. Good history of the settlement of Acadia and the dispersal of her people during the expulsion by the British.

Ledoux, Albert H. Les Mariages Acadiens du Quebec. State College, PA: Ledoux, 1981.

White, Stephen A. Dictionnaire Généalogique des Familles Acadiennes. Moncton, N.B.: Centre d'Études Acadiennes, Université de Moncton, 1999. 2 vols. French language. These two volumes are actually Part I of a larger work in progress. They cover the time period 1636 to 1714. Stephen White is the director of the Centre D'études Acadiennes at the University of Moncton, New Brunswick, and the world's foremost authority on Acadian culture, history, and genealogy.
