John and Priscilla by Robert C. Thompson, Editor Mayflower Log of Tennessee

Although John Alden and his famous wife Priscilla Mullinis have been the subject of historical tales and lore for three and a half centures, there is still much that we do not know about them. We do not know when or whether either John or Priscilla was born. We do not know when or specifically where they were married. We do not know when Priscilla died. And we do not know exactly where either is buried. — Alden Kindred of America, Inc.

Startling words, perhaps, for many of our Alden/Mullins descendants, and reason enough to review what we do know about these ancestors.

From Governor Bradford's first-hand account, we know that Priscilla was the daughter of William and Alice Mullins and came with them, and her brother, on the Mayflower. Mullins was a man of property as is evidenced by his will, a copy of which was carried by the Mayflower on its return to England. Within months of the Mayflower's arrival at Plymouth, Priscilla was the sole survivor of the foursome.

From Governor Bradford's account, we know that John Alden was a cooper (barrel-maker) by trade and was hired at Southampton for the specific purpose of fulfilling a requirement of English law that a cooper be aboard any ship "carrying beer beyond the sea." His contract allowed the option of remaining in the planned colony or returning to England. We know his ultimate decision.

Clearly, Priscilla and John must have been born in England. When John died in Duxbury on September 12, 1687, a "broadside' (early version of a news bulletin) was published stating that he was "about eighty-nine years of age. From this we can estimate that he was about 21-22 years old when he sailed on the Mayflower.

There is no record of John and Priscilla's marriage date. We do know, however, that the first wedding in the Colony occurred in May 1621 (Edward Winslow/ Susanna White), and from a preserved record of 1627 we find John and Priscilla as man and wife with two children. Therefore, it has been presumed that the marriage probably took place sometime between May 1621 and 1623. There appears to be no basis in fact for the triangular courtship described in Longfellow's "Courtship of Myles Standish" which many of us in our grade-school years assumed to represent the gospel truth.

Longfellow, incidentally, was a seventh-generation descendant of John and Priscilla!

It is known that sometime prior to 1627 the couple resided in a small house of their own. It was located on the one and only street in Plymouth, across from Governor Bradford. A replica of it stands today in Plymouth Plantation. But land grants were now established which permitted farms large enough to support a family. The Aldens drew a 100-acre grant near the mouth of Blue Fish River, in present-day Duxbury, some nine miles via shoreline north of the original tiny Plymouth community. It was good farm land which included some cleared upland where Indians had planted, some wood land, and a stretch of fresh and salt meadow where hay could be cut. There was a fresh water stream, a pond, and a spring.

By 1632 they had erected a house and moved permanently to this choice property. As it turned out, this was to be the first of two houses. No precise description of it exists, but an exploratory excavation in 1960 revealed remnants of its foundation and root cellar (which can be seen today). Some twenty years or so later, the second house was built, the one which is well-preserved and maintained today by Alden Kindred of America, Inc. This house is about 300 yards from the site of the first. It is a relatively large two-story house, built around a huge central chimney. To this new house John and Priscilla probably brought seven children ranging in age from about 23 down to 5.

Altogether, they eventually had 10 (possibly I 1) children and 68 grandchildren.

Although always a farmer and carpenter, John was also active in political and community affairs, as is evidenced by the following record: Member of a committee for raising a force against the Indians; surveyor; deputy from Duxbury from 1641 to 1649; member of the Colony's council of war four different times; treasurer 1656/58; Governor's Assistant 1632/41, 1650/86. Twice he was deputy governor, 1644/65 and 1677.

He was the last survivor of the signers of the Mayflower Compact.

Priscilla died sometime between 1680 and 1687. Although not accomplishing things that would qualify for definitive recognition in history books, she certainly deserves exceptional credit, for her role as a pioneer mother and supportive spouse. Priscilla and John are believed to be buried somewhere in the Old Burying ground, Duxbury, but original markers have long since disappeared, so precise location is unknown. The recent markers are merely in the general location.


